YOU'VE GOT MAIL

This spring, through a province-wide Community Well-Being Survey, thousands of Nova Scotians will be asked to participate in a 30-minute survey. In late April 2019 one in five NS households will receive a letter by regular mail, asking them to participate in this initiative. The mail will provide instructions and a PIN to complete the online survey, which will ask recipients how they feel they are doing across eight domains, to provide a more complete picture of well-being. These domains include: education; living standards; healthy populations; time use; leisure and culture; environment; democratic engagement; and community vitality.

The survey process will be overseen by the Canadian Index of Wellbeing, based at the University of Waterloo, to ensure the information gathered remains confidential and discretely and professionally managed. Once data is compiled, findings will be shared with the general public and organizations interested in learning from them to build a stronger Nova Scotia.

In our area, arrangements are underway with local library sites to provide support to survey invitees who may not have access to, or feel comfortable with, completing the survey online. As those plans are finalized, they will be communicated through local community and service organizations. This initiative will be of tremendous value and assistance to all organizations in NS. If you are one of the fortunate one-in-five households to receive the survey, we hope you will take 30 minutes to participate.
