“We are not alone” – Remember, you are a member of the family of Orchard Valley. If you need help, someone to pick up your meds, groceries or do an errand for you, then let us know. We will find a way to help you. Your Pastoral Care Committee will be reaching out to you to find out the best ways to communicate with you as we move forward. They will be asking if you have access to a computer, tablet, email or if you’d prefer we communicate by phone, mail or hand-delivery. We want to be able to keep you informed of any changes at Orchard Valley as we move forward in this new reality.

“We believe in God who works in us and others...” – We are a hopeful family, we continue to be there for members of our family, as well as those in our communities. We offer support through many of the programs that we are involved in. Our outreach programs offer services to those in ways that we as individuals may not be able to do by ourselves. During this time, while the majority of the programs are on hold, we can offer prayers to those who have to be away from their families. Healthcare workers are, and no doubt will be, putting in long hours and are taking the risks that they themselves may become infected. We can offer prayers for our leaders having to make decisions that affect so many people’s lives. We can offer prayers to those who are sick and the faith that they will recover. We can offer prayers to those who have lost loved ones. I know we have huge hearts and we can be there for others, whether it is in our prayers or in our deeds.

We are also investigating and organizing how, as members of the congregation, you can continue to support Orchard Valley in our efforts to care for those in our communities and Orchard Valley family. This may include volunteering to buy groceries for an elderly individual, doing an errand, or supporting OVUC’s work financially. We will continue to pay our staff through this time and support them in whatever ways we can. As we do our best to communicate with our church family through letters, emails and phone calls, we also have our website and our Facebook page. We will be using these tools as well to keep our family abreast of any changes or updates.
