Suggested Books

Cutting for Stone: Abraham Verghese

Twin boys, orphaned from birth, are raised by two doctors at a mission hospital in Ethiopia. Though they share a preternatural connection, the boys have quite different temperaments. Immersed in medical drama from a young age, both boys grow up with a passion and talent for medicine. As they come of age, one of the boys is forced to flee his homeland, which is in the throes of revolution. He ends up training to be a surgeon in New York City — a situation very different from that of his childhood.

The Farm: Joanne Ramos

Nestled in New York's Hudson Valley is a luxury retreat boasting every amenity: organic meals, personal fitness trainers, daily massages — and all of it for free. In fact, you're paid big money to stay here — more than you've ever drained of. The catch? For nine months, you cannot leave the grounds, your movements are monitored, and you are cut off from your former life while you dedicate yourself to the task of producing the perfect baby for someone else.

This story follows Jane, an immigrant from the Philippines who commits to being a surrogate in order to provide a better life for her baby daughter. Jane struggles to cope with the situation while wracked with worry for the daughter she left in another's care.

Maybe You Should Talk to Someone: Lori Gottlieb

Lori Gottlieb is a therapist who helps patients in a Los Angeles practice. Among her patients are: a self absorbed Hollywood producer, a young newlywed diagnosed with a terminal illness, a senior citizen planning suicide if nothing gets better, and a twenty-something woman who can't stop hooking up with the wrong guys. Then a personal crisis causes Lori to seek counselling for herself.

This book explores the brokenness of five very different people (including Lori herself) and the healing that they achieve from professional counselling.

Anxious People: Fredrik Bachmann

Having failed in a bank robbery attempt, the panicking robber flees and takes several hostages at an apartment open house. Each of the strangers carries a lifetime of grievances, hurts, secrets, and passions that are ready to boil over. And all of them — the bank robber included — desperately crave some sort of rescue. As the authorities surround the premises, these reluctant allies will reveal surprising truths about themselves and set in motion a chain of events so unexpected that even they can hardly explain what happens next.

This is a humorous, compassionate, and wise story of friendship, forgiveness, and hope.
