As we come to this table, we are reminded that this is the table of Jesus Christ, a banquet prepared for everyone. All who seek to be nourished and sustained in the journey of faith, all who seek wholeness and compassionate paths to peace and justice, are welcome here. This table is open to all.

The Invitation

God be with you.

And also with you.

We lift up our hearts.

We lift our hearts in prayer.

Let us give thanks to God.

It is good to give God thanks and praise.

Blessed are you, Breath of Peace, Giver of all life, Bringer of Joy, Source of Love that knows no boundaries. Your song of wisdom rang out before the world began; throughout the ages, your song of liberation has infused us with your hope for a world where:

those considered last and least are first and most; violence is overcome by the power of your ancient love; and all work together for peace.

You bring our longings to birth, and send prophets to awaken us to your approaching Advent.

We thank you for those who, like Mary, have the strength and courage to give birth to your love in the world;
